1 CORINTHIANS - IN ALL THINGS

HOW ARE THE DEAD RAISED?

1 Corinthians 15:35-58

Main Idea: *The promise of our resurrection, secured by Christ, proves that in Him nothing is wasted, not even death.*

Resurrection is the Way of God (vs. 35-49)

Resurrection is the Way In (vs. 50-57)

Resurrection is the Way to Live (vs. 58)

DISCUSSION & REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- What stood out most to you from this sermon? Why?
- How does God's assurance of your own bodily resurrection give you hope for a specific area of your life right now (relationships, job, health, future)?
- How would your daily life change if the hope of the resurrection was front of mind on a regular basis? In what ways are you tempted to live as if death has the final word?
- Does the future that this text describes ever seem too good to be true? How does Paul's focus on what God has already done in creation give you confidence in this promise?
- What is the Holy Spirit prompting you to do, change, or believe as a result of this passage?
