FAMILY OF PROMISE
OUR FRAILITY, GOD'S FORTITUDE
Genesis 35

Main Idea: In our frailty, God shows his fortitude— calling us back from our sin and holding fast to promises that our sadness cannot undo.

We are frail because we continue to sin (*ch. 34*)

God shows his fortitude in calling us back to him (*vv. 1-4*)

We are frail because we continue to experience sadness (*vv. 16-29*)

God shows his fortitude in giving us promises that will never fail (*vv. 9-15*)

Discussion & Reflection Questions

- What stood out most to you from this sermon? Why?
- What are the idols that may have survived your transformation? Do they seem to be more active or passive? What would repentance in these areas look like?
- Jacob experiences sadness after sadness. Have you ever experienced a season like that? How did you experience God's presence (or absence) during that time?
- God blessed Jacob right before some of the hardest seasons of his life. How does this challenge our typical definition of "blessing"?
- What might it practically look like to be honest about your frailty and more fully lean on God's fortitude?
