FAMILY OF PROMISE
THE JOURNEY OF RECONCILIATION
Genesis 42-44: Joseph's reunion with his brothers

Main Point: God is able to bring reconciliation to even the most broken relationships.

The Journey of Reconciliation:

- Begins with confession (42:18-24)

- Flourishes through mercy and compassion (42:25, 43:14, 30-31)

- Is witnessed by repentance (43:34, 44:1-34)

Judah – A Transformed Life (44:30-34)

Discussion & Reflection Questions

- What stood out most to you from this passage or sermon? Why
- What makes reconciliation in broken relationships so difficult?
- Why is it important for each person in a broken relationship to take ownership of their own sin rather than focus on the other person's failures?
- Extending mercy is often costly. Why is showing mercy to someone who has hurt you so difficult? What makes it worth pursuing?
- Why is genuine repentance essential for rebuilding trust? What does biblical repentance look like in practice?
- Is there a relationship in your life where God may be calling you to pursue reconciliation? What practical step could you take this week? How might you involve others to help encourage and support you in this journey?
